Reserved-seat football tickets on sale now

ARTESIA — Reserved-seat football ticket sales will continue through Friday, Aug. 22, in the AHS athletic office at Bulldog Pit.

During this period, only reserved-seat ticket holders from last season will be allowed to purchase their same seats. Lower-section reserved-seat tickets are \$30, while upper-deck, chair-back reserved seats are \$40. The athletic office is open from 8 a.m. - noon and 1-4 p.m. weekdays (please enter through the west doors) and during the noon hour on home-game Fridays only.

Last season's reserved-seat ticket holders will have until 4 p.m. Aug. 22 to claim their same seats. Unclaimed reserved seats will go on sale to the general public on a first come, first served basis on Monday, Aug. 25. Sales of single reserved-seat tickets - if available - will be conducted on home-game Fridays beginning Friday, Aug. 29, at a cost of \$7 for lower-section seats and \$9 for upper-deck seats.

Reserved-seat ticket book covers will also admit the holders to all junior varsity football games free of charge. JV general admission prices are \$2 for adults, \$1 for students.
